<u>Book</u>	<u>Key Word</u>	<u>Theme</u>
Job	Sovereignty	God revealed Himself in His majesty and power to Job. It became clear that the real issue was not Job's suffering (caused by Job's sin) but God's sovereignty.
Psalms	Worship	The five books of Psalms span the centuries from Moses to the postexilic period, covering the full range of human emotions and experiences. Suited for service as the temple hymnal, they were set to music and focused on worship.
Proverbs	Wisdom	Proverbs was designed to equip the reader in practical wisdom, discernment, discipline, and discre-

tion. The development of skills in all the details of life are stressed, so that beauty and righteousness will replace foolishness and evil through dependence upon God.

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The Preacher applied his great mind and resources to the quest for meaning and purpose in life. He found that wisdom, wealth, works, pleasure, and power all led to futility and striving after the wind. The only source of ultimate meaning and fulfillment is God Himself.

2. Wisdom and Instruction, and
3. General

C. In this study session, we will deal with Category 1, Memory, and in follow-on sessions, we will cover Categories 2 and 3 under the Books of Poetry. Therefore, let us continue on.
